






STATEWIDE RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES

Removes barriers to accessing recovery supports and services


Over 100 recovery focused organizations as registered members

RECOVERY COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

A Recovery Community Organization (RCO) is an independent, grassroots, non-profit organization providing a variety of activities available to all community members recovering from substance use, not restricted to individuals enrolled in a specific educational, treatment, or residential program. RCO's are created by the recovery community for the recovery community!


- Love-based peer recovery community where 'we are all recovering from something'

DISCOVERY CAFÉ OVERVIEW

- In partnership with the Division of Mental Health and Addiction, the Recovery Café Network and C4, We Bloom is piloting the first-ever Discovery Cafés in 4 counties around Indiana.
- Closely aligned with the spirit and structure of the Recovery Café model, with several key adaptations for youth ages 12-17:
 - Concept of 'discovery' is purposefully broad
 - Youth programming is youth-informed, youth-friendly and fun
 - Discovery Circles
 - School for Discovery
 - Intentional outreach to meet youth where they are

Regional Recovery Hubs Program

- Partnership with DMHA and the Governors Office
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions agencies and organizations throughout the state were unable to provide immediate services
- Mobilize peer workforce
- Provide services and support to marginalized populations
- Hubs have critical relationships throughout community
- Can triage all 92 counties
- Access point for community
- Both for mental health and/or substance use issues
- FULL continuum not just treatment
- Hubs can provide support to individuals pre- and post-treatment

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

MOU

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Between

The Artistic Recovery, Inc (dba Three20 Recovery

and

Bowen Center

Purpose of this Memorandum

The Artistic Recover, Inc (6ba Three20 Recovery) and Bowen Center, agree that Three20 Recovery will work in collaboration to provide shared resources and recovery support services. In this Memorandous of Understanding Three20 Recovery and Bowen Center shall be known individually as "party" and collectively as the "surties".

Terms

- Three20 Recovery shall evaluate and assess all consumers for long term recovery program and will notify Bowen Center of all Three20 Recovery referred consumers' enrollment status after the interview.
- II. Three20 Recovery will provide:
 - A. Virtual peer recovery support sessions lasting in duration of up to one hour per session and (up to a total of 6 individuals or 8 hours per week)
 - 8. Will work with peers to create personalized recovery plans based on chosen pathway and provide support services/connection
 - C. Resource referral and connection
- III. Consumers who are referred from Bowen Center will be required to sign a releas

of information to Three20 Recovery for continuity of care.

- IV. Three20 Recovery will provide monthly attendance reports and recovery plans for each Bowen Center referred client receiving recovery services from Three20 Recovery
- V: The terms of this MOU and performance of the duties hereunder may be extended only by agreement of both Parties in writing.

Terms of Confidentiality:

The parties agree to ensure that all operations and activities performed are complicate upplicable HIPAA policies and procedures pursuant to the Administrative Simplification translands of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1999 (C.F.R. Parts 60 and 141 and 42 C.F.R. Part 2 Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient tecords.

ndemnification:

The facilities hereby indemnify, defend and hold one another, their officers, agents and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for injury or damages arising out of their performance under this MOU, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional act or omission of the indemnifying party.

Amendment/Termination Terms:

This MOU may be amended by the mutual written consent of both parties.

This initial MOU may be terminated by either party with or without cause upon thirty days (30) written notice. Termination with or without cause shall not be construed to relieve PARTY 2.0 any responsibility pertaining to its balance owed of services rendered.

III. Consumers who are referred from Bowen Center will be required to sign a release of information to Three20 Recovery for continuity of care.

Terms of Confidentiality:

The parties agree to ensure that all operations and activities performed are compliant with applicable HIPPAA policies and procedures pursuant to the Administrative Simplification Standards of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (C.F.R Parts 160 and 164) and 42 C.F.R. Part 2 Confidentiality of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Patient Records.
