With the demonstration Indiana will receive an increased FMAP of 78%. This is expected to add \$200M in federal funds per year

to the state.



### **Certified Community Behavioral** Health Clinics (CCBHC)

- CCBHC is a federal outpatient model that allows for flexible funding.
- There are 9 core services including: crisis services, case management, outpatient mental health and substance use treatment.
- There are currently **8** pilot sites that have been selected.

#### Crisis Services

- SEA 1 (2023) provided \$100M over the last biennium to establish the Community Mental Health Fund - the majority of these funds went to establish crisis services.
- Over the last biennium 14 crisis receiving and stabilization facilities and 18 mobile crisis teams were built up.
- Crisis services are estimated to save jails and inpatient hospitalizations \$126M.
- Eventually, CCBHC will absorb the cost of crisis services.

#### 988 Call Centers

- 988 is required in response to federal legislation.
- There are 5 response centers responding to crisis calls, chats, and texts.
- 988 has seen a **115%** growth from June 2023 to July 2024.



Group homes primarily serve the seriously mentally ill (SMI) population, this includes those diagnosed with schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, etc. The only funding group homes receive currently is for services.

A *new line item* room and board rate for these facilities will ensure that they have sustainable funding for operational costs and that beds can remain open for future patients.
